TRAINING OVERVIEW

It is estimated by the International Labour Organization that 24.9 million people are in situations of forced labour across the globe. Forced labour and human trafficking is in violation of our constitution of the Republic of South Africa.

In line with the Prevention and Combating of Trafficking in Person Act (2013) (PACOTIP) Government departments and civil society organizations have an important role to play in addressing this issue.

This e-learning module is an effective tool aimed to support government departments and civil society organizations to take action to prevent these human rights violations from occurring.

LEARNING OUTCOMES

- 1 Understand what modern slavery, forced labour and hidden exploitation is.
- 2 Know who is vulnerable to forced labour and how it can occur in agriculture.
- 3 Recognise how to spot the signs of forced labour and hidden labour exploitation.
- 4 Know what you and your department can do to protect individuals from exploitation.

The module takes approximately 40 minutes to complete and is designed to be interactive and supported by engaging videos and knowledge checks.
